School Characteristics

Waterford Union High School is a comprehensive high school grades nine through twelve, with an enrollment of approximately 1,075 students. Waterford Union High School is located in the western Racine County, approximately 25 miles from downtown Milwaukee. Schools that feed into the High School include Drought Elementary, North Cape Elementary, St. Thomas Aquinas, Washington-Caldwell, and Waterford Graded.

The district has a 16-1 student to teacher ratio; it also employs four school counselors, a librarian, and a school psychologist. The district has five administrators and technology specialist. Support staff and instructional aides are also available to help operate and enhance the educational process.

Waterford Union High School offers a full range of courses from college preparatory to remedial. Our school's strong and successful college preparatory program consists of honors courses, advanced courses, and Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Twenty-four credits are required for graduation, including:

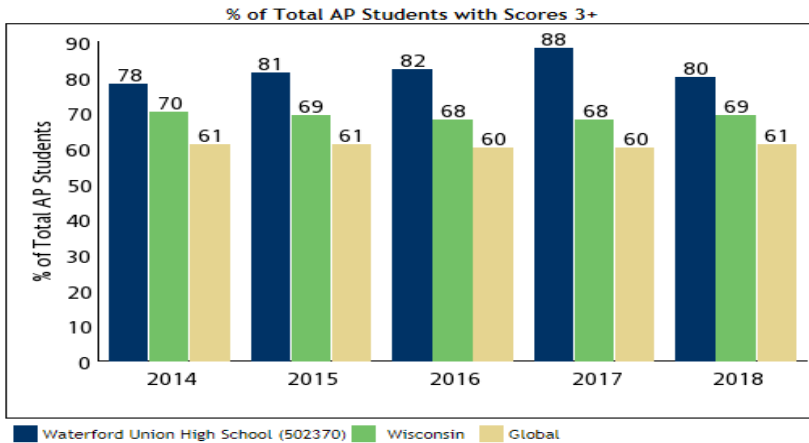
- Four credits of English (including Speech or Drama)
